

## Congressman Mahoney by the Numbers

### Mahoney Ranked Most Effective New Congressman

Congressman Mahoney was named the Most Effective and Powerful New Congressman by Congress.org's annual Power Rankings, based on his successful record advancing legislating on homeowners' insurance, senior housing, biofuels and Everglades Restoration. The Power Rankings rank Members' power based upon legislative accomplishments and influence.

### Congressman Mahoney's Votes Rank "In the Middle"

Congressman Mahoney was ranked as the "Man in the Middle" by the National Journal for being the singular Congressman with a voting record that falls precisely in the middle of all 435 members. After analyzing 107 votes on key issues like immigration, fiscal and tax policy, the war and foreign policy, The National Journal found that Mahoney's record placed him dead square in the middle of all his colleagues, with half voting to his left and the other half voting with the right.

Recognized by U.S.  
Chamber for Pro-Business Leadership

The United States Chamber of Commerce awarded Congressman Mahoney the "Spirit of Enterprise" award in April 2008 for his strong support of a pro-economic growth agenda in Congress during 2007.

Congressman Mahoney received a 75% score from the Chamber last year, based on his votes on key business issues identified by the Chamber as a priority. Those members of Congress who support the Chamber's position on at least 70% of those votes receive the "Spirit of Enterprise" award.

Republicans Vote  
with Congressman Mahoney

Using the Washington Post's Congressional Vote Tracker, which has been collecting data since 1991, an average of 57 Republicans (or 28 percent of House Republicans) vote with Congressman Mahoney on major pieces of legislation.

Voting Record

Congressman Mahoney has been present for 1201 out of 1215 votes cast, or 98.9%.
